We're proud to launch the **new Workforce Trends Dashboard**—a powerful tool that provides a clear view of our local workforce. The dashboard highlights:


- **Our supply of local talent:** See how many people have the skills employers need right now and which professions our talent has today.

The Rapid Response event at Trilogy Plastics brought together local employers, workforce partners, and employees for a day of career connections. To encourage participation, Trilogy implemented an engagement initiative with a raffle and check-off sheet, prompting job seekers to visit at least ten employers, fostering meaningful conversations throughout the event.

Employers praised the event's organization, communication, and collaboration. Powell Industries, though unable to attend in person, ensured their presence by providing company materials in advance—demonstrating strong coordination and partnership.

Several job offers were extended immediately following the event, including a confirmed hire at Ohio Gratings for an Assistant Press Welder Operator earning \$21 per hour. The event showcased the impact of collaboration, creativity, and a shared commitment to supporting local workforce transitions.


